- 5. Receive phone call and/or email in August with information regarding when class schedules will be available to view on Aeries.



How do I know which courses my student will be taking?

Core class placement is based on teacher recommendation, placement testing and intervention needs. You will receive a letter with your student's core classes.

When will schedules be available?

Schedules will be available for pick up at Freshmen Orientation in August and posted on Aeries.

When is Freshmen Orientation?

Freshmen Orientation will be held the week before school starts in August. You will receive a phone call, and a message from Parent Square this spring with the exact date, please plan vacations accordingly. This is a student-only event. Students will pick up their schedule, take school pictures, receive their school ID, take a campus tour and much more!

Does my student need PE clothes?

Yes. Students may purchase PE clothes from school or bring a plain grey t-shirt or sweatshirt with plain black shorts or sweatpants from home. PE clothes are available for purchase online prior to the beginning of school ONLY.

What kind of lunch program do you offer?



Breakfast and lunch are served daily in our cafeteria and from food carts located in the quad. Parents are encouraged to

complete the Annual Free & Reduced Lunch form available online through our website. Applications are also available on campus.

What transportation options are available for my student?

Residential addresses located outside a three-mile radius of Righetti High School are eligible for bus transportation. The District Transportation Department will mail a letter to eligible families regarding bus schedules just before school begins. Student must present school ID to board bus.

How can I check my student's progress in class?

Parents can check their student's progress, assignments and attendance through the Aeries Parent Portal. An email is sent with log in information as soon as your email is entered into our system during registration. If you do not receive log in

information, please contact the Counseling & Guidance Office for assistance.



How do I excuse my student's absence?

- All methods must include student's first name, last name, grade, ID number, date & reason for absence, parent/guardian name & relationship to student and phone number where parent/guardian can be reached.
- After two days all unexcused absences become cuts per California Ed. Code.





RHS 2022-23 FRESHMAN ELECTIVE OFFERINGS

Students take 20 elective credits their freshmen year. 5 credits of Health are REQUIRED (one semester) and 5 credits (one semester) of one of the following courses: Prod 301/ Life & Career Planning or Leadership Intro to ASB. These single semester courses will be paired with Health to make 10 credits (one year) of instruction. The remaining 10 credits will be chosen from the list of year-long electives below.

	COURSES TO BE PAIRED WITH HEALTH (required for all freshman)		
Course	Description	Credits	A-G
Health REQUIRED (Pair with a course below)	Health is a semester course which will cover mental health, human growth, body systems, nutrition, chemical dependency, STD's and family planning. Emphasis will be on long term lifestyle changes to promote a long and healthy life. The curriculum includes: Personal Safety awareness, Mental Illness, the relationship between Diet and Disease, an investigation of Communicable Diseases, the critical components of a Healthy Pregnancy, and a broad overview of Family Planning Methods. This course will provide 5 units of Health.	5	No
Prod 301/Life & Career Planning	Introduces students to a decision-making process that will help them envision and plan for a future career that is productive, achievable, and stimulating. This course culminates with the development of a 10-year career/education plan used for advisory and academic purposes. This personalized 10-year plan provides students with the focus and intrinsic motivation to succeed in high school, college, at work, and in life.	5	No
Leadership Intro to ASB	This class is designed specifically for freshman students only. Leadership skills are developed through participation in the planning and implementation of a variety of student and staff activities.	5	No
A-G APPR	OVED COURSES (recommended for college bound students and meet A-G requirements for colle	ge entran	ce)
Ag Mechanics	This class is designed to make students aware that an advanced educational background is necessary to pursue a career in agriculture repair or general farming. The class will teach basic shop skills including woodworking, rope work, plumbing, electrical and tool sharpening. Taking class enables the student to participate in FFA activities.	10	"g"
Animal Science	This course will expand the knowledge of advanced topics in animal science including animal nutrition, physiology, reproduction, proper care of animals, animal health practices and management techniques.	10	"g"
Art, Intro	This course is designed to explore basic principles of design and color utilizing exercises in various media, including paper cutout, poster colors, felt tip pens, pencil, colored pencil & ink with emphasis placed on practical application. Additional emphasis will be placed on portfolio presentation of work.	10	"f"
AVID	The Mission of AVID is to ensure that all students, and most especially the least served students who are in the middle will succeed in rigorous curriculum, will complete a rigorous college preparatory path, will enter mainstream activities of the school, will increase their enrollment in four-year colleges and will become educated and responsible participants and leaders in a democratic society. Ballet Folklorico/AHC Dance 140	This course is an advanced performing dance class. Regional traditional dances from Mexico will be taught including footwork, regional styles, stage presence and choreography. It also provides instruction on the aesthetic, cultural and historical dimensions of Ballet Folklorico. **Concurrent AHC course.	10	"f"
Computer Apps A/B	The purpose of this course is to expand the student's technology skills and knowledge through utilization of 21st Century technology tools, as well as other school coursework. Students will learn the basic features of Microsoft Office including Word, Power Point, Excel and Publisher. Advanced Internet research for various types of reports will also be covered. Students will use Typing Master Pro software to improve keyboarding skills.	10	"g"
Choir, Concert	Concert Choir is a beginning course for all students interested in choral music. This course develops basic music skills, basic music vocabulary and beginning sight reading. Students will learn about breathing, pitch and tone, vowel sounds, diction and how to follow a part in written music. This group sings in all the concerts. This course may be repeated until ready to audition for Varsity Choir and Madrigals.	10	"f"
Choir, Varsity	Varsity Choir is open to all students in all grades. This is "the" school choir. This course is designed to develop the 4- part choral sound, sight reading skills, ability to hold their part against others, and cappella music. This choir does multiple concerts each year. Students must audition for this course.	10	" f"
Culinary Arts 1	Culinary Arts 1 is designed to provide students with the competencies needed in the areas of food and nutrition. Students will learn basic concepts of nutrition, resource conservation, food preparation, food preservation, use of consumer resources and agencies, and the relationship of nutrition and physical fitness to good health.	10	"g"
Floral Design	Students will become acquainted with theories and principles of artistic design and their influence on the floral industry. Students will gain knowledge and skills to understand artistic perception, creative expression, historical and cultural context. Assignments will be based on abstract, two- and three-dimensional designs, historical culture, theory, color theory, and analytical critiques of various floral art works.	10	"f"
French 1	This is a 3-yr French program. You begin with French Intro* followed by 2 years of Concurrent classes in partnership with AHC. The courses are designed to introduce the students to basic communication skills in reading, writing, listening, and speaking. The language will be taught through a Global Citizen lens. Gradually, you will be able to communicate in French with French speakers around the world. It will be an asset when entering the job market.	10	"e"
Guitar	This course is open to all students interested in learning to play the guitar or to improve their existing skills. Individuals as well as groups will work on learning the fundamentals of playing the guitar, as well as music fundamentals including music reading, and basic music theory. Students will also work on learning advanced chords, finger picking, and working with different musical styles. In addition, students will learn the history of the guitar and related instruments.	10	"ę"
Jazz Ensemble	Survey of all jazz styles to include Big-Band Swing, and Rock and Roll. Students will perform concerts and improvise melody over a stylistic chord progression.	10	"f"
